There are 14 facilities where the pass is accepted. This supports students to gain interest in visiting these areas.

“International Academic City”

How many universities do you think Kyoto has? The prefecture itself has 49 universities and junior colleges. 140,000 students, one tenth of 1.47 million in Kyoto-city, live here. Kyoto has the largest proportion of students to the city population in Japan. 6,900 students from about 200 countries study here. Kyoto has its own well-rounded student supporting systems as well as facilities.

“Advanced City”

Kyoto is not just a historical and traditional city. Along with caring for our long lasting traditions comes with industries with the mentality of creating what is “New”. Companies that work globally such as Nintendo, Kyocera, Omron are companies that have their headquarters in Kyoto. Also, Kyoto is an academic powerhouse, research collaboration with university is actively pursued. Recently, Professor Shinya Yamanaka has received the Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine for the iPS Cell Research. Professor Toshihide Masukawa from Kyoto Sangyo University received The Nobel Prize in Physics.

“City of Youth”

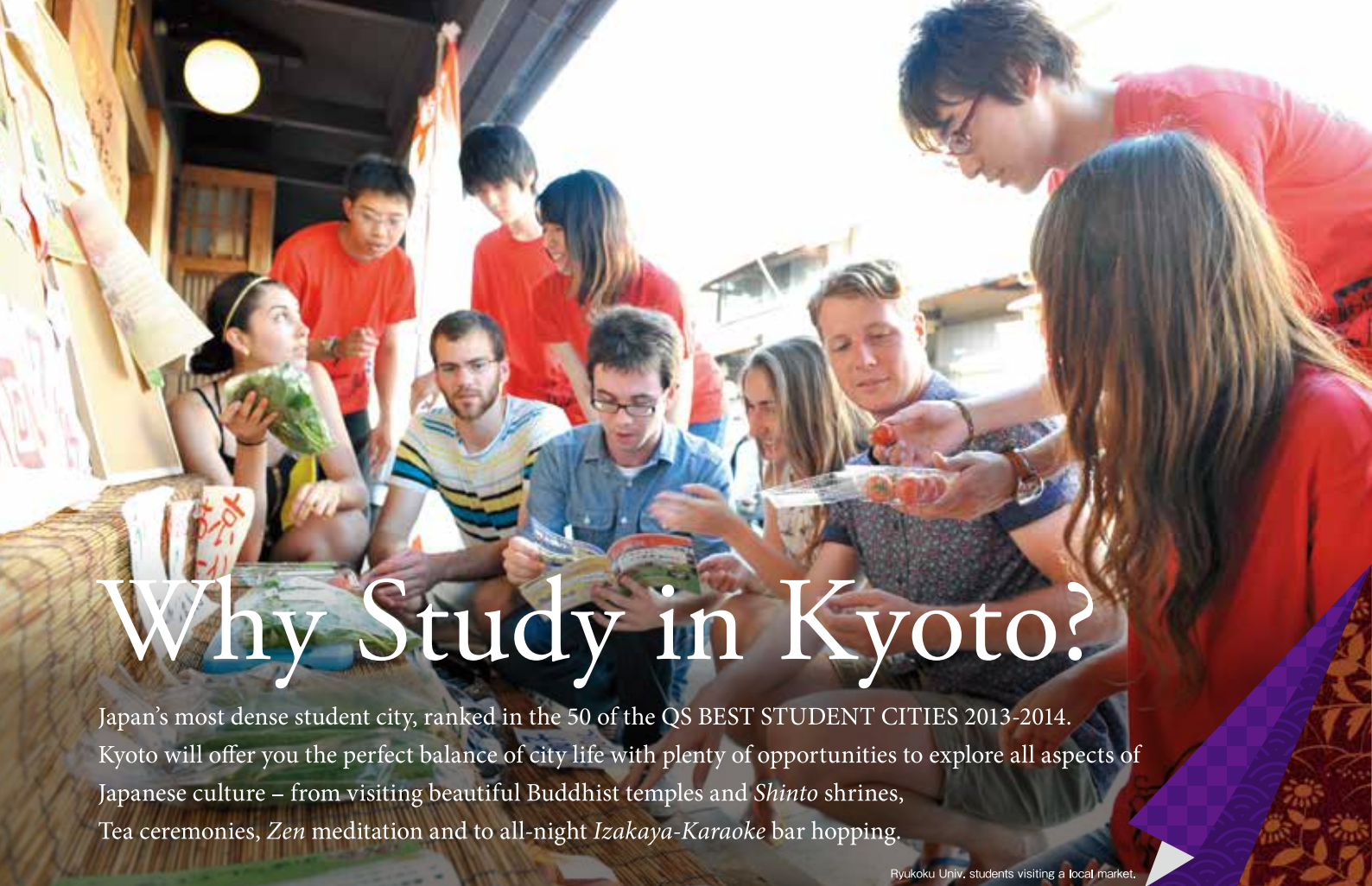
Kyoto is a students centering city of cultural dispatch. There are 6 art schools in Kyoto and many graduates fly all over the world and set foot outside of Japan. There are also *Manga* and anime museums that are highly popular internationally. It is gaining popularity by visitors from abroad as well as students. Kyoto Intercollegiate Festival (*Kyoto Gakusei Saiten*) gathers 180,000 visitors annually. Kyoto International Student Film & Video Festival is the largest student film festival in the country. Student directors from all over the world present their works and awarded films are screened during the festival week.

“Accessible City”

After a journey of traveling the sky, by taking the express train from Kansai Airport (Osaka), you will reach the city of Kyoto in approximately 1 hour and 15 minutes. Kyoto will welcome you with the “*Omotenashi*” spirit. This is the traditional Japanese way of hospitality with the most dedicated and exquisite manners. You will perhaps want to know more about Japan and visit various cities. Going to the Capital Tokyo will take 2 hours and 15 minutes by *Shinkansen*. Osaka which is known for its own food and entertainment takes about 30 minutes by train.

“Beautiful City”

Kyoto is surrounded by mountains in three directions. There is the *Kamo* River which flows from the north to the south of the city. The nature and historical landmarks create the beautiful city. Kyoto will impress you with its beauty for four seasons. Kyoto is a safe place and convenient place in Japan and will kindly welcome you.

The support is for international students who have trouble finding a guarantor to rent a private apartment, The Kyoto Area Foreign Students Housing Support System Organization, which 9 universities and other related organizations in Kyoto participate in, can give student assistance.

Part-time Jobs

While studying in Kyoto, you are able to work for less than 28 hours per week. Many students decide to work as a shop staff or caterer, but in Kyoto, you are able to work part time for local events such as the *Jidai* Festival or work as a *Miko*, who works for shrines, especially during the new year season.



Kokoka Family Program

For adjusting to the new environment easily and quickly, local Kyoto volunteer families become your supporters. Family and students spend their time together and deepen mutual understanding.



Health Insurance Subsidy (Ryugakusei Kokuho Hojo)

Privately financed international students who live in Kyoto city, you will receive 700 yen per month for the National Health Insurance subsidy.



Special Support Available in Kyoto

Free invitation to cultural areas, traditional entertainment and concerts. With the *Ryugakusei Okoshiyasu Pass* you are able to visit 14 historical facilities in Kyoto. Free invitation to *Kyogen* performance and concert by Kyoto Symphony Orchestra, etc...



Law, Visa counselling Service and Medical and Administration Translation

Kyoto city holds 4 counseling events known as Counseling Day. You are able to discuss various topics in 6 different languages. They have medical translators so that you can trustfully receive medical service as well.





Theme: Student Experience in Kyoto

Student Talk Session

MC: 10 international students from five different universities shared their student experience in Kyoto.



Q What was your motivation for coming to Kyoto? Have you had other options like Tokyo, Osaka?

Florentin For me it's very important to understand Japanese politics and culture, so **I thought Kyoto would be the best start.**

Katherine I was here in Japan for a week and half for my high school graduation, stayed in Osaka, but the minute that I came to Kyoto, I **immediately fell in love** with it, **this is the place I feel most at home.**

Sena I had like 4 options, not Tokyo for me, it would be too crowded. I like temples so I think Kyoto is good for me.

Pichaya I came here 4 years ago once, when I think of Japan, the first thing I think is Kyoto, culture and food... **People here is very nice.** Actually my senior told me that Ryukoku University has many camps, tours and lots of things I can do, like making Udon. So nice place to come.

Nikan I was in Kyoto once back in 2008 for vacation and I liked city and this is my first reason and second reason for me is Kyoto University reputation.

Casper For me similar to what Pichaya were saying, for foreigner, think of Japan, sort of the Japan what they want, it really what Kyoto is, really brilliant combination of modern stuff with the traditional here, like architecture, can't find anywhere else.

Shantu I am here for the study, my major is Buddhism, Buddhism is not popular in my country. Ryukoku is the centre for the study so that's why I'm here.

Christopher I didn't have the options to choose from, Kyoto University happened to have a MOU with University of Ghana and my professor recommended me.

Christian I've travelled Japan a bit before and decided to come here for exchange, it's drawing for me especially going to Ryukoku University was that education is very important to me and Ryukoku has been a centre of learning for longer than my country Australia has been a country and **there are so many universities in Kyoto** and its **always been the place for learning and culture.**

Yi-Ping For me, I'm opposite, I had a lot of choices, from Hokkaido to Kyushu, I like slow paced city, people here are relaxed and you can talk to people, that's why I choose Kyoto.

Q How did you adjust yourself into a new life? Were there any hardships? Easy to find Japanese friends?

Katherine The best advice I got was to **be prepared to be embarrassed** over and over and to be expecting that so that when that happens you can get over quickly and continue push forward to you can keep meeting people and putting yourself up and really helped a lot.

Florentine I tried to avoid mistakes but you will be coming to the situation where you are embarrassed, but you don't need a language to make yourself understandable, but good thing about Kyoto is that **people help you out even though they don't speak your language.**

Pichaya Fortunately my senior has been here for 2 years, he introduced lots of Japanese friends to me. My university organize lots of international parties, gathering with Japanese people and **we can make friends.**

Casper You simply **do things you would do at home**, I'm interested in Japanese martial arts, I joined 'dojo' (training place) outside of the university, so naturally people there have similar interests and you can meet wide variety of people.

Sena First few days were hard, but once school started, you can meet people, I'm half Japanese so I knew already what I should expect so there was no culture shock for me.

Christopher It wasn't so hard to get integrated into Japanese culture because my professor gave me an orientation. Also this is not the first time to live outside so I know how it is to live outside my country.

Yi-Ping I feel really supported because there are a lot of organizations here. I **joined in KORYU family** (Kokoka Family Program) I had lunches with them couple of times, and also joined in Chinese class in my university, there are a lot of students are interested in Chinese and Chinese culture so it was easy to find friends.

Q What is your favourite place in Kyoto ?

Christian *Higashiyama*. I like *Higashiyama*, *Higashiyama-ku*. There are **museums, galleries also temples** there. I like the scenery too.

Pichaya *Kiyomizu-dera* and *Gion-Shijo*. I like *Kiyomizu temple*, I like the **beautiful scenery**, I like the stage. I like the street from *Kiyomizu* to *Yasaka-Jinja*, there are Japanese shops around that area.

Christopher *Arashiyama*, because **beautiful leaves.**

Nikan *Kamitakano*, this is where I live, it's such a lovely place to live especially it takes about 5 minutes from my house to *Hieizan* and it makes me feel safe and home.

Shantu *Kinkaku-ji*. It's famous place, but I choose this because this is beautiful.

Sena *Ginkaku-ji*. It was **hard to choose one place**, this is one of the most liked temple so far.

Yi-Ping *Ninna-ji*. I went there with my friends, there are few foreigners there. There is a Japanese garden called 'Karesansui' (Traditional Japanese garden), **I get the feeling of 'Wafu'** (Japanese taste).

Florentin *Kurama*, it's closer to my university, it's quiet, I like walking and **I enjoy nature**. I really enjoy walking in *Kurama*, I also look forward to 'Himatsuri' (The *Kurama* Fire Festival).

Casper *Nanzen-ji*. Even though it's famous temple so lot of visitors there, but it's wide so you still have peaceful time there. You can also walk into mountains, **good place to start hiking**.

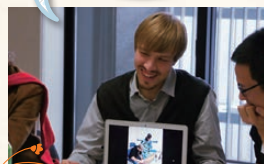

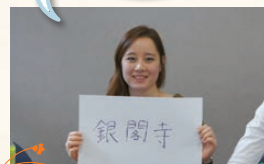

Q What are your advices for your friends thinking about coming to Japan for study?

Katherine You will have so much experience, but in Kyoto, more like in Kansai region, people have **particular warmth**, people are **sweet and accepted**.

Florentin When you study abroad, not only a study is important, also **experience is important**. When it comes to culture, Kyoto is still the capital of Japanese culture and **there is a nice mixture of modern and old aged Japanese culture here**. Even if you want to go and experience big city in Japan, Osaka is very close by. So I think Kyoto is the good place to stay and you can find what the Japan is.

Christian Kyoto is unique and special, no matter where you go in Japan, **there is nowhere quite like this place.**



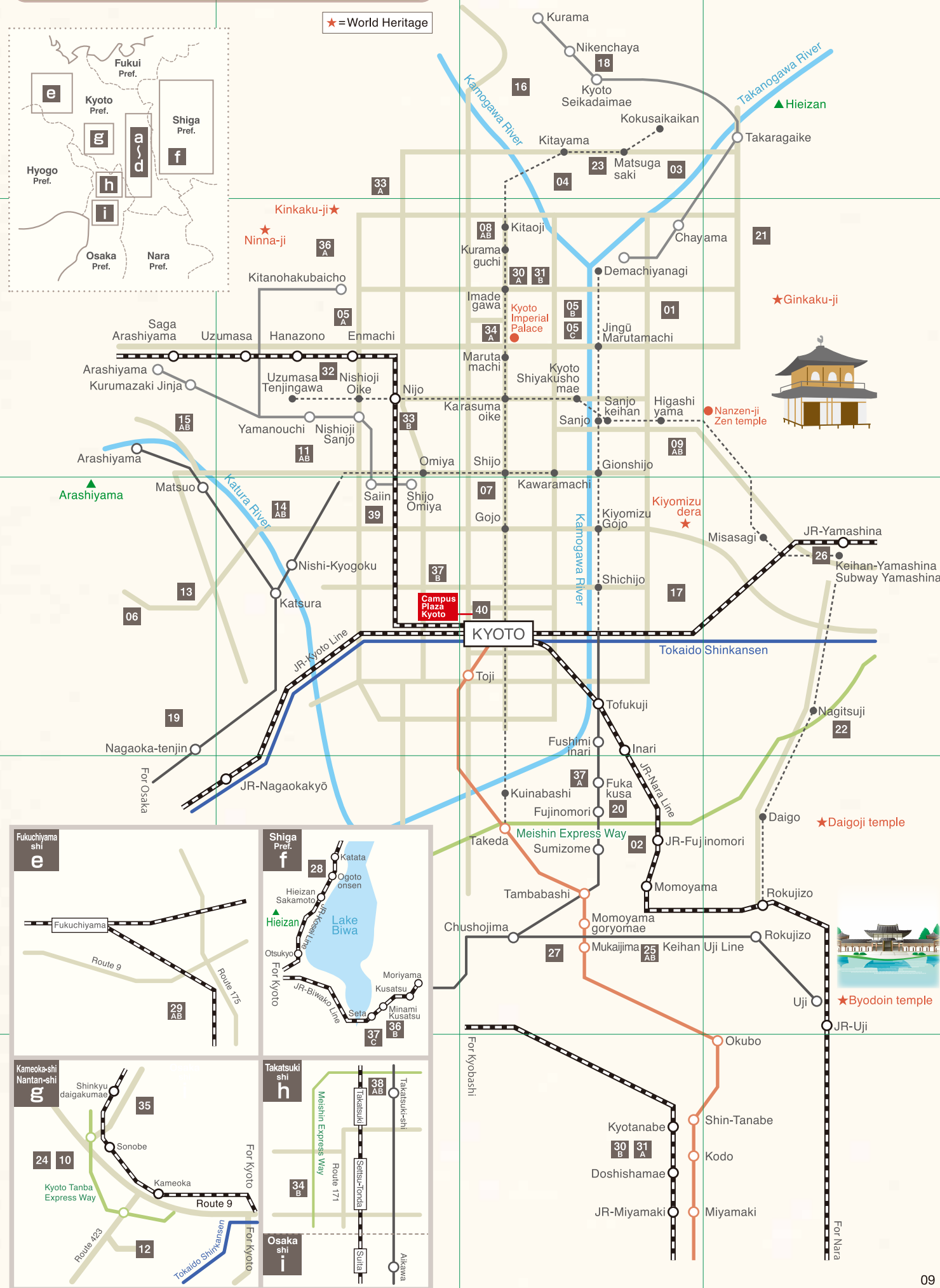
Kyoto Universities location Map
